

Peter Kosinski: I'll call the meeting of the State Board of Elections to order today on October 3, 2018 at the Board of Elections. I'm Peter Kosinski. Joining us on video conference are Commissioner Kellner, Commissioner Peterson and Commissioner Spano. Today's meeting is for rulings on ballot access. We have two issues before us. Both rulings are for the 5th Judicial District. We have one objection to the Republican candidates to that district and one to the Conservative nomination of candidates to that district. The objections relate to the conduct of the meeting which was held for both nominating purposes. The recommendation on both specifications from staff is that they remain valid, that these are issues that this board cannot resolve because they go beyond our capabilities. And that based on that they remain valid. Is there any discussion?

Douglas Kellner: I move the adoption of the staff report.

I understand there are some objections still out that may come in. And we may have to hold another one of these meetings before the 25th. So, if we do, we will notify everybody.
