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1 6217.1 Purpose

2 Pursuant to New York Election Law section 5-614, the State Board of Elections (State
3 Board) hereby adopts the following regulations in relation to the operation of the statewide voter
4 registration list to be known as NYSVoter. NYSVoter includes both NYSVoter I and II.
5 NYSVoter I covers the development and the initial data collection phase. NYSVoter II covers the
6 complete networked phase of the list.

7 NYSVoter shall serve as the single, interactive, statewide voter registration list for storing
8 and managing the official list of registered voters throughout the State. It shall be maintained
9 and administered by the State Board. NYSVoter shall maintain one record for each registered
10 voter including the statewide unique identifier, current voting eligibility status of the voter and
11 voter history, including but not limited to, voting history, previous name(s) and addresses. A
12 voter's Driver's License or Non-Driver's Identification Number or any portion of the Social
13 Security Number shall not be released for public inspection. The information contained in the
14 statewide voter registration list shall not be used for non-election purposes.

15 The County Boards of Elections (County Board) have sole responsibility for adding,
16 changing, canceling or removing voter registration records from the statewide voter registration
17 list. The State Board shall make accessible to each local board of elections the statewide voter
18 registration list. Such list shall be maintained in a computerized form which permits different
19 user interfaces.

20 *After initial creation, NYSVoter must maintain a transaction history of changes made to*
21 *each voter record, including but not limited to: each change made and reasons therefore; the*
22 *date and time stamp to record the date of change; the ID of the county board operator and*
23 *system that updated the record; and a description of the key elements that were changed. * The*
24 *italicized portion of this section shall not pertain to NYSVoter I.*

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1 NYSVoter shall operate on a twenty-four hour a day, seven days a week basis (e.g. the
2 system must be accessible during election periods) except for any required maintenance periods,
3 that shall be scheduled to minimize impact on the State Board and county boards' election
4 administration and voter registration functions. In the event that a transaction is not processed the
5 County Board shall be notified with the reason.

1 6217.2 Initial Creation of the Statewide Voter Registration List

- 2 1. The official statewide voter registration list shall be created by combining the existing
3 voter registration lists maintained by each local board of elections into a single integrated
4 list.
- 5 2. To the maximum extent practicable, each local board of elections shall continue to use its
6 existing computer infrastructure, computer software and database applications to access
7 data from and transmit data to the statewide voter registration list.
- 8 3. The information required to be sent to the State Board to appear on the list shall be
9 determined by the State Board Commissioners.
- 10 4. To create such list, each local board of elections shall transmit to the State Board a
11 certified copy of the voter registration records of such board in an electronic format
12 prescribed by the State Board and continuing as directed by the State Board.
- 13 5. Once all data from the counties has been received, the State Board shall run a check for
14 duplicate voter registration records within the integrated statewide voter registration list
15 as provided for in these regulations.
- 16 6. After all duplicate registration issues have been resolved, the State Board shall assign a
17 unique identifier to every voter on NYSVoter; *and the County Board shall append the*
18 *same unique identifier to any corresponding county record.* * The italicized portion of
19 sub-section 6 shall not pertain to NYSVoter I.

1 6217.3 Review of County Voter Registration Systems

- 2 1. Prior to sending data to the statewide list, any proposed county voter registration system
3 must be approved by the State Board to ensure it meets the technical specifications
4 promulgated by the State Board to interface with the official statewide voter registration
5 list. For proposed systems, this approval must be obtained prior to the purchase or
6 installation of the system.
- 7 2. A county voter registration system must have the capability to:
- 8 a. Store information required in New York State Election Law and these regulations;
 - 9 b. Generate a list of registered voters in a county and their registration statuses;
 - 10 c. Track information specific to single elections, including the issuance and return
11 of absentee ballots; and
 - 12 d. Store and provide images of signatures of registered voters.
- 13 3. A county's voter registration system must conform to all of the requirements of state law
14 and of these regulations, and if it does not, the State Board must notify the County Board
15 of the nature of the nonconformity. The County Board must correct the nonconforming
16 aspects of the county voter registration system and provide to the State Board such
17 evidence of the change or changes in the system as that office may deem appropriate.
- 18 4. NYSVoter shall ensure all data complies with the data standards for the database. County
19 systems must be remediated so that all required data is sent to the centralized database.

1 6217.4 Voter Registration Information Entry

2 1. Using the county's voter registration system as their direct interface to NYSVoter, County
3 election officials shall enter all voter registration information into the list on an expedited
4 basis at the time the information is provided to the county official. Each County Board
5 must enter and maintain voter registration records in a county voter registration system.
6 County Boards have the responsibility for adding, changing, canceling or removing voter
7 registration records in NYSVoter. NYSVoter, shall normalize to standards and store voter
8 registrant information provided on the registration applicant. County voter registration
9 systems shall synchronize with NYSVoter I at least every 24 hours.

10 2. Each NYSVoter record must contain at least the following information :

- 11 a. Full Name including, last name, first name, middle initial and name suffix.
- 12 b. Residence Address including house number or apartment number, half code, street
13 name and direction, city and five-digit Zip code and Zip code plus 4.
- 14 c. Mailing Address including house, apartment number, or post office box number,
15 street name and direction, city, state and five-digit Zip code and Zip code plus 4.
- 16 d. United States Postal Service Coding Accuracy Support Service address (if
17 available). This is the process of correcting mailing address lists to conform to
18 United States Postal Service standards. This improves the accuracy of the postal
19 carrier route, five-digit Zip code and Zip code plus 4, and delivery point codes that
20 appear on mail pieces. * Section 2 (d) shall not pertain to NYSVoter I.
- 21 e. Birth date.
- 22 f. Telephone Number (if indicated).
- 23 g. Gender (if indicated).
- 24 h. New York State Department of Motor Vehicles driver's license number or non-

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1 driver's identification number or the Last 4 Digits of Social Security Number or
2 an indication that the voter has neither number.

3 i. Political Party Enrollment or Affiliation (or lack thereof).

4 j. County Voter Registration Number.

5 k. County Code.

6 l. Data Entry Date - the date that the voter registration data was entered into the
7 system.

8 m. Application Date - Also known as the timestamp date, is the date on which the
9 voter registration application was marked as being received and is the date of
10 voting eligibility of the registrant.

11 n. Application source code - NYSVoter shall collect and track the source of voter
12 registration applications and summarize and report on registration activity in
13 accordance with National Voter Registration Act reporting requirements.

14 o. Identification Required Flag.

15 p. Identification Verification Requirement Met Flag.

16 q. Voter Status codes.

17 r. Official district information including home political subdivision, election district,
18 town, town ward, Congressional, Senate and Assembly districts.

19 s. Voting History - including, whether a voter voted in an election (State, federal,
20 and local elections), last year voted, last county voted in.

21 t. Voter Transaction History - including, address changes, and name changes.

22 u. Signature of the voter - NYSVoter shall capture and store a graphic image of the
23 signature on a registration application. NYSVoter shall receive and store an image
24 of the signature captured and provided by the county voter registration system.

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- 1 i. Ease of Signature Comparison - The signatures shall be stored in a way to
2 enhance speed of display. * This sub-section shall not pertain to
3 NYSVoter I.
- 4 ii. Restrictions of Image Editing - NYSVoter shall not allow the authorized
5 user to modify the basic characteristics, structure, and recognizable format
6 of the registrant's signature. * Section 2 (u)(i, ii) shall not pertain to
7 NYSVoter I.

1 6217.5 Voter Registration Processing

2 1. In order to vote in New York State, a person must possess the constitutional and statutory
3 qualifications of an elector and must be registered to vote, and if required, be enrolled in a
4 political party.

5 a. Qualifications to register to vote:

6 i. United States citizen;

7 ii. Eighteen years of age or older on election day; and

8 iii. Resident in New York State and of the county, city or village for a
9 minimum of thirty days next preceding such election.

10 b. Disqualifications from voter registration:

11 i. Death;

12 ii. Sentenced to prison based upon a felony conviction;

13 iii. Moves out of their county of residence; or

14 iv. Adjudged mentally incompetent by the order of a court.

15 2. When a voter registration application is received, the County Board is responsible for
16 processing each application and determining whether the application is complete and
17 whether the applicant meets constitutional and statutory requirements. All voter
18 registration applications shall be date and time stamped to establish eligibility and to
19 establish the time lapse of no more than 21 days maximum for a completely processed
20 voter registration. Procedures for opening mail, time stamping documents or pre-
21 screening, to the extent that they are not prescribed by these regulations, are left to the
22 county boards to establish.

23 3. All voter registration activity must be done by a bipartisan team of workers, to assure
24 fairness and uniformity in the process.

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- 1 a. Bipartisan processing:
- 2 i. Staff members of one party reviews and enters the information from either
- 3 an individual application or a batch of applications, electronically signing
- 4 their work.
- 5 ii. The work on that application or batch of applications is proofread and
- 6 reviewed by a staff member of the opposite party, who also electronically
- 7 signs their work.
- 8 iii. Any edits or changes to the information initially entered must be made and
- 9 signed by the two staff persons of opposite parties.
- 10 iv. Once signed by two staff persons of opposite parties, the information is
- 11 sent from the county registration system to NYSVoter for inclusion on the
- 12 statewide list of registered voters, and verification of each voter's identity.
- 13 4. Once an application for registration has been entered it is processed in one of three ways:
- 14 a. Registered - The voter's registration record has been updated with all possible
- 15 information
- 16 b. Incomplete - A voter registration application is incomplete if it does not contain
- 17 the following information necessary to establish eligibility and enable the board to
- 18 verify the applicant's identity:
- 19 i. The applicant's name;
- 20 ii. The applicant's complete residence address;
- 21 iii. The applicant's date of birth;
- 22 iv. A mark in the checkbox affirming the applicant is a citizen of the United
- 23 States;
- 24 v. A mark in the checkbox indicating that the applicant is 18 years old or will

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- 1 be by the end of the year;
- 2 vi. The applicant's current and valid New York driver's license number or, the
- 3 Non-driver's identification number; or
- 4 vii. If the applicant has not been issued a current and valid New York driver's
- 5 license or Non-drivers's identification card, the last four digits of the
- 6 applicant's social security number; or
- 7 viii. In the case where an applicant has not been issued a current and valid New
- 8 York driver's license or Non-driver's identification card or social security
- 9 number, the applicant shall affirm this fact in the manner prescribed in the
- 10 uniform statewide voter registration application; and
- 11 ix. Original signature of the applicant swearing or affirming that the
- 12 information contained in the registration application is true.
- 13 x. If any of the required information is missing on the voter registration
- 14 application, the county board shall take immediate steps to obtain
- 15 complete information. If the missing information is necessary to establish
- 16 the applicant's eligibility to register i.e. name, date of birth, residence
- 17 address, citizenship and signature; the form shall be incomplete. In any
- 18 such case the county board shall notify the applicant of the reasons that the
- 19 registration application is incomplete and the period of time in which the
- 20 application information must be provided in order to be eligible to vote in
- 21 the next election. When the missing information is necessary to verify the
- 22 applicant's identity and all required eligibility information is complete, the
- 23 application shall be processed, the applicant registered, and a notice of
- 24 approval which includes an indication that the county board has not been

1 able to verify the identity of the applicant and a request for more
2 information so that such verification may be completed shall be sent to the
3 registrant pursuant to statute and these regulations.

4 c. Denied - Once an application is denied, the voter is provided a notification. The
5 following are the reasons for an application being denied:

- 6 i. Applicant was not 17 years old on the date of the application; or
- 7 ii. The applicant is not a US Citizen.
- 8 iii. A denied voter is not sent an application form with a Denial letter since a
9 new application will not cure the problem (with the exception of the under
10 17 voter, where time will take care of the problem).

11 5. Following entry into the county voter registration system, all information in the
12 application for voter registration must be transferred electronically to NYSVoter which
13 will then electronically notify the county voter registration system with a response that
14 includes confirmation of the transaction, an assigned unique identifier and registration
15 status in NYSVoter. NYSVoter shall assign a unique identifier to every voter that will
16 remain with the voter for their voting life.

1 6217.6 Voter Identification Verification

- 2 1. The County Board shall promptly, and in any event, not later than twenty-one days after
3 receipt by it of the voter registration application, verify the identity of the applicant who
4 has not previously had his or her identification verified. The voter's registration and
5 enrollment shall be complete upon receipt of the application by the appropriate County
6 Board. The failure of a County Board to verify an applicant's identity shall not be the
7 basis for the rejection of a voter's application, provided, however, that such verification
8 failure shall be the basis for requiring County Board to take the additional verification
9 steps provided by the Election Law and these regulations.
- 10 2. In order to do so, the County Board shall utilize the information provided on the
11 application and shall attempt to verify such information with the information provided by
12 the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles, or the United State Social Security
13 Administration and any other lawfully available information source. The County Board
14 shall do so by transmitting such information to NYSVoter. The County Board shall deem
15 as verified for the purposes of this Section of these rules an application received from the
16 Department of Motor Vehicles processed simultaneously and integrated with an
17 application for a motor vehicle driver's license, a driver's license renewal or an
18 identification card if such card is issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles in its
19 normal course of business, pursuant to Section 5-212 of the Election Law.
- 20 3. NYSVoter shall compare the New York State Department of Motor Vehicle driver
21 license or non-driver number, name, date of birth and gender of the voter with the New
22 York State Department of Motor Vehicle records for verification of the voter's
23 identification as required by statute. The New York State Department of Motor Vehicles
24 shall report back to NYSVoter. Based upon this report, the County Board shall determine

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1 if they have sufficient information to verify the voter's identity, or whether additional
2 information is required to verify the voter's identity.

3 4. If necessary to verify a voter's identity, NYSVoter shall compare the last 4 digits of the
4 voter's Social Security Number, name and date of birth, through the New York State
5 Department of Motor Vehicles with the United States Social Security Administration
6 records for verification of the voter's identification as required by statute. The United
7 States Social Security Administration through the New York State Department of Motor
8 Vehicles shall report back to NYSVoter. Based upon this report, the County Board shall
9 determine if they have sufficient information to verify the voter's identity, or whether
10 additional information is required to verify the voter's identity.

11 5. If the County Board is unable to verify the identity of the applicant within twenty-one
12 days of the receipt of the application, it shall immediately take steps to confirm that the
13 information provided by the applicant was accurately utilized by such County Board, was
14 accurately verified with other information sources and that no data entry error, or other
15 similar type of error, occurred.

16 6. Following completion of the preceding steps, the County Board shall mail

17 a. a notice of its approval, or

18 b. a notice of its approval which includes an indication that such board has not yet
19 been able to verify the identity of the applicant and a request for more information
20 so that such verification may be completed, or

21 c. a notice of its rejection of the application to the applicant in a form approved by
22 the State Board.

23 7. The request for more information shall inform the voter that: "THE FAILURE TO
24 CONTACT THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS AND CORRECT ANY INACCURACIES

1 IN THE APPLICATION OR PROVIDE REQUESTED ADDITIONAL INFORMATION
2 MAY RESULT IN A REQUEST FOR IDENTIFICATION AT THE POLLS IN ORDER
3 TO CAST A VOTE ON A VOTING MACHINE." If such notice is returned undelivered
4 without a new address, the board shall forthwith send such applicant a confirmation
5 notice pursuant to the provisions of section 5-712 of the Election Law and place such
6 applicant in inactive status.

7 8. Notices of approval, notices of approval with requests for more information or notices of
8 rejection shall be sent by nonforwardable first class or return postage guaranteed mail on
9 which is endorsed "ADDRESS CORRECTION REQUESTED" and which contains a
10 request that any such mail received for persons not residing at the address be dropped
11 back in the mail.

12 9. If the board of elections has been unable to verify the identity of the applicant within
13 forty-five days of the application, the board shall mail a second request for more
14 information to the applicant. This notice shall inform the voter that "THE FAILURE TO
15 CONTACT THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS AND CORRECT ANY INACCURACIES
16 IN THE APPLICATION OR PROVIDE REQUESTED ADDITIONAL INFORMATION
17 MAY RESULT IN A REQUEST FOR IDENTIFICATION AT THE POLLS IN ORDER
18 TO CAST A VOTE ON A VOTING MACHINE."

19 10. If the board of elections remains unable to verify the identity of the voter it shall so
20 indicate with a notation next to the voter's name in the registration list. Such a voter may
21 provide information to assist the County Board to verify his or her identity at any time
22 and such notation shall be removed by the board of elections upon such verification.

23 11. If the County Board is unable to verify the identity of the applicant it shall so indicate
24 with a notation next to the voter's name on the registration list. Such voter may provide

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1 information to assist the County Board to verify their identity at any time and such
2 notation shall be removed by the County Board upon such verification.

3 12. If a voter's identity is not verified before election day, the voter will be asked to provided
4 identification before they vote for the first time. Forms of identification include a valid
5 photo identification, a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, or some
6 other form of government document that shows the voter's name and address. If the voter
7 provides such identification or the voter cast an affidavit ballot and the county board
8 verifies the identity of such affidavit voter the County Board shall indicate to NYSVoter
9 that the voter's identity has been verified.

10 13. The notices of approval and notices of approval with requests for more information shall
11 also advise the registrant:

- 12 a. of the date when his registration and enrollment is effective,
- 13 b. of the date and the hours of the next regularly scheduled primary or general
14 election in which he will be eligible to vote,
- 15 c. of the location of the polling place of the election district in which he is or will be
16 a qualified voter, whether such polling place is accessible to physically
17 handicapped voters,
- 18 d. an indication that physically handicapped voters or voters who are ill or voters
19 who will be out of the city or county on the day of the primary or general election,
20 may obtain an absentee ballot and the phone number to call for absentee ballot
21 applications,
- 22 e. the phone numbers to call for location of polling places, to obtain registration
23 forms and the phone number to call to indicate that the voter is willing to serve on
24 election day as an inspector, poll clerk or interpreter.

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- 1 14. The notice of approval, notice of approval with request for more information or notice of
2 rejection shall also advise the applicant to notify the board of elections if there is any
3 inaccuracy. The form of such mail notification shall be prescribed by the State Board and
4 shall contain such other information and instructions as it may reasonably require to carry
5 out the purposes of the Election law and these regulations.
- 6 15. The notice of rejection shall also advise the applicant with instructions on how to
7 complete the application and the period of time which the application must be provided in
8 order to be eligible to vote in the next election. The form of such mail notification shall
9 be prescribed by the State Board and shall contain such other information and instructions
10 as it may reasonably require to carry out the purposes of the Election law and these
11 regulations.

1 6217.7 Processing Voters Who Move Between Counties *

- 2 1. *NYSVoter shall identify as voters that have moved between counties those voters who*
3 *have stated on their application that the last year they voted was in a county other than*
4 *where they are applying to register to vote and the voter provided the previous address at*
5 *which they were registered.*
- 6 2. NYSVoter shall verify that a voter has moved between counties based upon a match of an
7 applicant's name, date of birth, *signature and either the New York State Department of*
8 *Motor Vehicle driver license or non-driver number or last 4 digits of the voter's Social*
9 *Security number or matching of the previous address of the voter.*
- 10 3. NYSVoter shall notify the “to county” and “from county” if a voter has moved their
11 voter registration between the counties.
- 12 4. *NYSVoter shall facilitate the move process if the “to county” has been informed of the*
13 *registrant's “from county” on the voter registration form or from the registrant. In such*
14 *cases, the “from county,” upon determining that such records are for the same voter, shall*
15 *cancel the voter record in their county and provide the required cancellation notice to the*
16 *voter pursuant to section 5-402 of the Election Law. After determining that the voter has*
17 *moved, the “to county” will activate a new record and substitute the unique identifier*
18 *with the unique identifier from the “from county”.*
- 19 5. In such cases where the “from county” is unable to determine that the proposed duplicate
20 records are from the same voter, after providing the required notice to the voter, the “from
21 county” will inactivate their voter record.
- 22 6. * The italicized portions of this Section shall not pertain to NYSVoter I.

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1 6217.8 Processing Duplicate Voters *

2 1. NYSVoter shall perform a *near real time* duplicate check to identify existing records at
3 *or* near the time of data entry for all registration application transactions or as needed by
4 the County Board.

5 2. NYSVoter shall identify possible duplicate voter registrations *based upon a match of an*
6 *applicant's first three letters of the first name and the first five letters of the last name,*
7 *date of birth, and, if available, the unique identification number, or the New York State*
8 *Department of Motor Vehicle driver license or non-driver number or last 4 digits of the*
9 *voter's Social Security number.*

10 3. *The voter's signature shall be made available to the County Boards for comparison.*

11 4. NYSVoter shall notify the "to county" and "from county" if a voter is a potential
12 duplicate registration between the counties. The notification shall include pertinent
13 information regarding the voter.

14 5. If the information received by the board of elections through NYSVoter indicates that a
15 voter is currently registered to vote more than once, the local board of elections
16 containing the registration record of the earlier dated registration record, the "from
17 county", shall send such voter the confirmation notice prescribed by section 5-712 of the
18 Election Law and place such voter on inactive status pursuant to section 5-213 of the
19 Election Law.

20 6. After determining that the voter is a duplicate, the "to county" will activate a new record
21 *and substitute the unique identifier with the unique identifier from the "from county".*

22 7. * The italicized portions of this Section does not pertain to NYSVoter I.

1 6217.9 Voter Registration Status

2 1. Each voter maintained in NYSVoter will be assigned a Voter Registration Status by the
3 County Board which will determine the voter's eligibility to vote. The Voter Registration
4 Status will be updated after an application is processed and an application disposition has
5 been assigned. The discreet voter registration statuses and their definitions to be stored by
6 NYSVoter are described below.

7 a. Active - The voter is properly registered. The voter is eligible to vote in elections.

8 b. Inactive - The voter is still eligible to vote in elections, but is not included in the
9 poll book. NYSVoter shall allow a county election official to designate a voter as
10 inactive, noting the reason for the designation, such as "election material mailed to
11 registrant returned as undeliverable" or "moved with an out of county forwarding
12 address", "affidavit ballots".

13 c. Purged - The voter is no longer eligible to vote in an election, and will not appear
14 in the list of registered voters. This list is to be utilized to prevent deceased voters
15 from overwhelming valid voters when doing voter searches; to allow for voters
16 who later re-register to vote to resurrect and utilize their unique identifier.

17 d. Denied - The person was not a registered voter, and their most recent attempt at
18 registration was denied.

19 e. Incomplete - The person is not a registered voter, and their most recent
20 registration attempt was Incomplete.

21 f. Preregistered - The voter has met all the requirements to be an Active voter but
22 has not yet attained the age of 18. Pre-registered voters that will be 18 years old on
23 or before the election date are included in the poll book and are eligible to vote in
24 the election. The voter must be 17 years old to pre-register.

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- 1 g. Other Voter Status - NYSVoter may store the voter status of statutorily required
2 voters including: Military, Uniform and Overseas Citizens, and Special Federal .
3 h. Reason codes indicating or explaining the reason for a specific voter's status may
4 be included.

1 6217.10 Voter Registration List Changes and List Maintenance

2 1. List Maintenance Activities and Schedules

3 a. The State Board, in consultation with local boards of elections, shall establish
4 minimum standards for statewide voter registration list maintenance activities and
5 schedules for such activities.

6 b. The list maintenance performed shall be conducted in a manner consistent with
7 the Election Law and these regulations to ensure that:

8 i. the name of each registered voter appears in the statewide voter
9 registration list;

10 ii. only names of persons who are not registered or who are not eligible to
11 vote are removed from such list; and

12 iii. the prior registrations of duplicate names are removed from such list.

13 2. Notices of cancellation

14 a. Where a County Board determines that a voter's registration shall be cancelled,
15 the record shall be flagged with the appropriate cancellation code and a
16 cancellation notice as provided for in Election Law section 5-402, shall be sent to
17 the voter, except that no cancellation notice shall be sent to a person whose voter
18 registration record has been flagged as deceased or who has made a personal
19 request for such cancellation.

20 b. The County Board shall electronically file with the State Board a cancellation and
21 removal report indicating all cancellations and removal actions taken by the local
22 board of elections from the list of eligible voters. Such report shall be filed in a
23 format and at such intervals as directed by the State Board..

24 3. Address, Name and Enrollment Changes within a County

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- 1 a. When a review and query of a voter registration application indicates that the
2 voter is already registered to vote within the county, and is initiating a change to
3 their record, such change shall be processed, and the record updated and the
4 appropriate notice shall be sent to the voter:
- 5 i. For an address change - a transfer notice as provided for in Election Law
6 section 5-208 (1)(5).
- 7 ii. For a name change, or the addition or deletion of a post office box - an
8 approval notice as provided for in Election Law section 5-210 (9).
- 9 iii. For a change of enrollment - a letter from the County Board confirming
10 receipt of the same and stating the effective date of the enrollment change.
- 11 b. Before an update or change can be applied to an existing voter registration record,
12 a County Board shall perform a search of existing voters to ensure that the
13 application is not a new registration and is an update or change to an existing
14 record within the county.
- 15 4. Notifications of a Death, Felony Conviction or Adjudication of Mental Incompetence
- 16 a. NYSVoter shall receive death notifications including the voter's first name,
17 middle name, last name, gender, date of death, date of birth, street address, city,
18 and zip code, from New York State Department of Health and New York City
19 Department of Health and Mental Health. NYSVoter may be matched against the
20 United States Social Security Administration's Master Death Index. Notification
21 shall be sent to the appropriate county for follow-up and determination.
- 22 b. NYSVoter shall receive notices of felons sentenced to a term of imprisonment
23 and of persons adjudicated mentally incompetent including the voter's last name,
24 first name, middle name, gender, date of birth, street address, city, state, zip code,

1 county, and a code indicating whether the person is a convicted felon sentenced
2 to a term of imprisonment or a person adjudicated mentally incompetent from the
3 New York State Office of Court Administration or any court having jurisdiction
4 over such matters. Notifications shall be sent to the appropriate county for
5 follow-up and determination.

- 6 c. Each local board of elections shall, within twenty-five days after receiving such
7 list of decedents or list of persons subject to forfeiture of the right to vote pursuant
8 to section 5-106 of the Election Law, use such lists to identify and remove
9 decedents and persons subject to forfeiture of the right to vote pursuant to section
10 5-106 of this article from the list of eligible voters.

11 5. Notices of License Surrenders

- 12 a. NYSVoter may receive data from New York State Department of Motor Vehicles
13 regarding license surrenders which are caused by the voter moving out of state.
14 Notification shall be sent to the appropriate county for follow-up and
15 determination.

16 6. National Change of Address

- 17 a. National Change of Address processing shall be conducted with a United States
18 Postal Service approved vendor at least annually. The processing shall at a
19 minimum identify voter address change information, whether permanent or
20 temporary; provide data which can be used to standardize addresses and provide
21 enhanced zip code extensions, to assist in more accurate delivery of voter mail;
22 and notification of deceased status. Notifications shall be sent to the appropriate
23 county for follow-up and determination.

1 6217.11 Voter Registration List Security and User Administration

2 1. Statewide

3 a. NYSVoter relies on shared security with both the county board and State Board
4 having responsibilities over specific system resources and administration. The
5 State Board will be responsible for providing tools necessary for county boards to
6 authorize local users to NYSVoter functions, verify that local users identified in
7 transaction headers are authorized for that purpose, and for insuring that a
8 message was not altered in transmission.

9 2. County Board

10 a. Security over county voter registration systems and networks, administration of
11 local users, authentication and authorization of county board personnel will be the
12 responsibility of each county board. Each county board will configure the local
13 county user to have access pursuant to NYSVoter. Since access to NYSVoter will
14 be through the county voter registration system, administration and authorization
15 to the county voter registration system must include the assignment of a user ID
16 and password for the county voter registration system that has a role or user-based
17 security management. County boards will have the rights to create and modify
18 county users as well as delete users when appropriate in their own county.

1 6217.12 Reports and Information Queries

2 1. NYSVoter shall provide to county board operators the ability to:

3 a. query all records in the database, regardless of county;

4 b. conduct user-defined searches of voter records;

5 c. generate pre-defined and ad-hoc queries and reports in formats as needed;

6 d. filter reports based on key data fields contained in the output (e.g. date, county);

7 e. provide a third party reporting tool (e.g. query by example) for ad hoc reporting
8 requests; and

9 f. sort voter registration data by county, election district, jurisdiction, birth date, and
10 other information (e.g. last name, first name, voter registration number, unique
11 identification number, address order).
