

Section 6200.1 is hereby repealed and replaced with a new section 6200.1 to read as follows:

6200.1 Places for filing statements of campaign receipts and expenditures.

(a) The places for filing statements of campaign receipts and expenditures pursuant to sections 14-102, 14-104 and 14-105 of the Election Law shall be as follows:

- (1) All candidates for election to public office or nomination for any office at a primary election or convention, all political committees supporting or opposing such candidates or otherwise participating in such elections and all political committees supporting or opposing a ballot proposal, shall file all statements of campaign receipts and expenditures with the State Board of Elections, unless otherwise specified herein.
- (2) Candidates for election to a village office or nomination for any such office at a primary election or convention, political committees supporting or opposing such candidates or otherwise participating solely in such elections and political committees supporting or opposing a ballot proposal solely within the village, shall file with the village clerk, unless the village has opted, pursuant to section 15-104(d) of the Election Law, to have elections occur on the day of the general election or be conducted by the county board of elections on any other day, then with the State Board of Elections.
- (3) Candidates for election or nomination for the offices of City Council, Mayor, Public Advocate, Comptroller and Borough President within the City of New York, and political committees supporting or opposing such candidates or otherwise solely participating in such elections, with the New York City Campaign Finance Board.

(b) Any candidate or political committee which is required to file statements with the State Board of Elections shall file such statements electronically with the State Board of Elections pursuant to its electronic reporting system, established pursuant to Election Law, section 3-102(9-A), or on paper if an exemption from the electronic filing requirements has been granted by the State Board of Elections pursuant to Election Law, section 14-102(4) or 14-104(2). The statements filed with the State Board of Elections are available for public inspection or copying via the State Board of Election's website.
